Notability

- Organize text files, photos, and hand written notes.
- Annotate with Apple Pencil.
 - Import your notes and write directly on them!
- Link Recordings.
 - When using the audio recording feature, it will link to any notes you take while recording.
- Can use it for an online planner.
- Paid subscription of 11.99 a year and only available on the Apple app store.



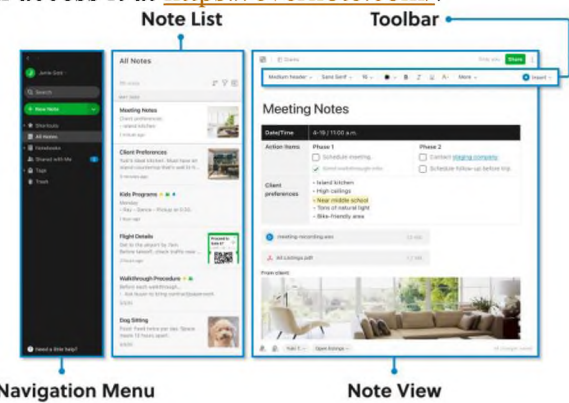
Goodnotes

- Organize notes in a folder.
- Create subfolders
- Annotate documents
- Search handwriting
- Study with flashcards
- Save and Reuse Elements
- Available on the Apple Store, free up to 3 notebooks.



Evernote

- Available on all platforms.
- Create and assign tasks inside your notes.
- Scan and import documents.
- You can save webpages for easy access, in a form of a button.
- Can connect with the Google Calendar.
- Free, but they also have paid options.
- You can access it at <https://evernote.com/>.



Google Doc's

- This works similarly to Microsoft word.
- You can create a document, and then have it saved to the cloud.
- Cost: Free! You just need to create a google account.



OneNote

- Keyboard and stylus entry.
- Syncs audio recording to notes
- Version history
- Cost: Purchased with your Microsoft office bundle. (There are Different bundles Microsoft offers)
